BIHAR STATE POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD

Bihar State Pollution Control Board (BSPCB) is the apex body to keep the pollution under control in the state through enforcement of various environmental legislations. Economic development has hastened industrialization, thereby, putting additional burden on natural resources and environment. The present challenges include conservation of resources, managing the ever growing solid waste particularly e-waste, ensuring treatment of domestic sewage and maintaining purity of our water systems. Board has been developing its capability to address these challenges.

Important Regulations related with Pollution Control and Environmental Conservation:

- ◆ The Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974
- ♦ The Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981
- ♦ The Environment (Protection) Act, 1986
- ♦ The Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991

In the year 2016, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Govt. of India has notified new rules for management of different type of waste in supersession of earlier rules. Some of important rules are as follows:-

EIA Notification, 2006

- → The EIA Notification, 2006 mandates prior Environmental Clearance (EC) for new projects or activities including expansion, or modernization of existing projects listed in its Schedule. The Category 'A' projects shall obtain EC from the Central Government and Category 'B' projects from the concerned State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA). The EIA Notification, 2006 prescribes that Category 'B' projects, will be further categorized as category 'B1' and 'B2'. The projects categorized as B1 will require EIA Report for appraisal and to undergo public consultation process (as applicable). Projects categorized as 'B2' will be appraised based on the application in Form-I accompanied with the Pre-feasibility Report and any other documents.
- Industries are classified on the basis of type of industry and their capacity. For example: All Molasses based distilleries and non-molasses based distilleries with a capacity 30 KLD and above are placed in category 'A' whereas, non-molasses based distilleries with a capacity of less than 30 KLD are placed in category 'B'.

Section 25 of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974

No person, without previous consent of the State Board shall establish or operate any industry, which is likely to discharge sewage or trade effluent into a stream or well or sewer or on land.

Section 21 of the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981

 No person, without previous consent of the State Board shall establish or operate any industrial plant in an air pollution control area.

Rule-6 of the Hazardous and Other Wastes (Management and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016

- Every occupier of the facility who is engaged in handling of hazardous and others wastes is required to obtain an authorization from the State Pollution Control Board under these rules.
 Such application for authorization shall be accompanied with a copy each of the following documents, namely
- Consent to Establish granted by the State Pollution Control Board under the Water and Air Acts.
- Consent to Operate granted by the State Pollution Control Board under the Water and Air Acts.
- In case of renewal of authorization, a self certified compliance report in respect of effluent, emission standards and the conditions specified in the authorization for hazardous and other wastes:

The Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991

- The owners are liable to give relief as specified in Schedule to any person (other than a workman) in case of death or injury or damage to any property resulted from an accident, as per section-3(1).
- The owners shall take out one or more insurance policies equivalent to the paid up capital or Rs.50 crore, whichever is less.
- The owner shall also pay contribution to the Environmental Relief Fund (ERF) annually, established by the Central Government (MoEF&CC), an amount equal to the amount of premium of insurance policy taken by the owner through the insurer.

The Manufacture, Storage and Import of Hazardous Chemical Rules, 1989

- The Occupiers are required to identify the major accident hazard and to take adequate steps for prevention of accidents and to limit their consequences to the persons and the environment.
- The Occupiers are also required to obtain the approval before undertaking any industrial activity.
- ◆ They have to prepare safety report and on-site emergency plan as applicable.

The Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001. Amended, 2010

- ◆ Dealers are required to be registered with State Pollution Control Board for five years by submitting application in Form-IV, in addition to submission of half yearly Return to SPCB.
- Other Stake holders such as manufacturers, importers, assemblers and re-conditioners are required to set up collection centres either individually or jointly for collection of used batteries in addition to submission of Half yearly Return to SPCB.

The Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016

Producer, recyclers and manufacturers are required to be registered with SPCB.

BSPCB has developed Online Consent Management and Monitoring System (OCMMS) for CTE/CTO/Authorization

- Online Consent Management & Monitoring System (OCMMS) is a web based application for Consent Management developed by the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India with the support of National Informatics Center, New Delhi for the use of Bihar State Pollution Control Board.
- This system has been developed to improve the efficiency of the processing of the consent applications and to enhance the transparency with which the consents/authorizations are granted.
- → The users of the OCMMS are broadly divided into two parts BSPCB User and Industry/Health Care establishment(HCE) user.

Features of OCMMS

- Unified Global online application/ portal
- ♦ Role based application access

- ♦ Multi level Security Enabled System
- ◆ Online Industry Registration for Consent/ Authorization
- Online Submission of Application, submission of fee, Approval, Clarification and other activities for CTE, CTO for all category of Industries/Institutions
- ♦ Consent Monitoring & Management
- ♦ Laboratory Management
- ♦ Waste Management
- ◆ Reports Generation

Steps to use OCMMS

- ♦ Open the URL (http://bhocmms.nic.in/) in the browser.
- ♦ Click"New Registration"
- ♦ New Registration form will be displayed.
- ◆ User fills the required information and click "Submit".
- ♦ Once submitted, System will validate the input data.
- If data is incorrect or mandatory information not filled, then the system will prompt the user to fill/correct the relevant information required.
- If the data filled by the applicant is correct, then the System will generate a temporary user name and password and will be displayed on the screen and the same will be automatically sent to the applicant in the form of SMS to the registered mobile phone and as e-mail to the registered e-mail ID.

Documents Required for CTE

- ◆ PAN Card and Aadhar Card/Voter ID
- Land Document: Registered Sale Deed/ Lease deed / Land Possession Certificate (LPC) / Land receipt
- Project Report consisting of total Project cost, Project details, Manufacturing process, List of Plant & machinery, Proposed pollution control measures.
- ♦ Location Map.
- ◆ Plant lay out map.
- Undertaking regarding distance of different land marks from the unit boundary as mentioned in application.
- ◆ Copy of Environmental Clearance (E.C.) from Competent Authority, if required.

Documents Required for CTO

- ◆ PAN Card and Aadhar Card/Voter ID
- Copy of CTE/ previous CTO along with compliance report of the conditions imposed therein with evidences like photograph, Reports, bills, receipts, etc.
- ◆ Copy of Environmental Clearance (E.C.) with compliance report.
- Undertaking regarding compliance of CTE/ previous CTO conditions. (in the prescribed format).

Suvidha Kendra

In order to help the entrepreneurs in filling up online application for Consent / Authorisation the Board has established a Suvidha Kendra at its headquarters. This Suvidha Kendra:

- ◆ Facilitates filling of Online application for CTE/CTO/Authorisation under various Acts / Rules.
- Helps industry to know the status of their application.
- ♦ Helps in resolving the issues related to OCMMS.
- Helps applicants for timely compliance of online clarifications/queries for speedy disposal.

The service of Suvidha Kendra can be obtained on payment of a fee of Rs. 1000 (one thousand) only.
